But first she must free it from the clutches of The Horde. Incidentally, Masters Of The Universe fans, look out for He-Man in the early episodes.



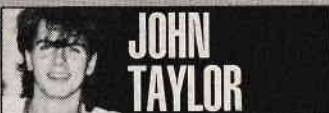
IS IT CRICKET?

■ "*Whatever Happened To Baby Jane* is a classic. It starred Bette Davis (below). I like those old 40s movies."



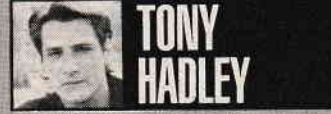

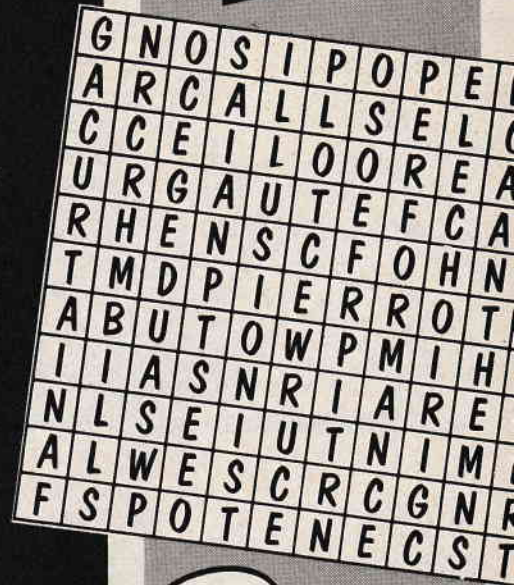
WORD SEARCH

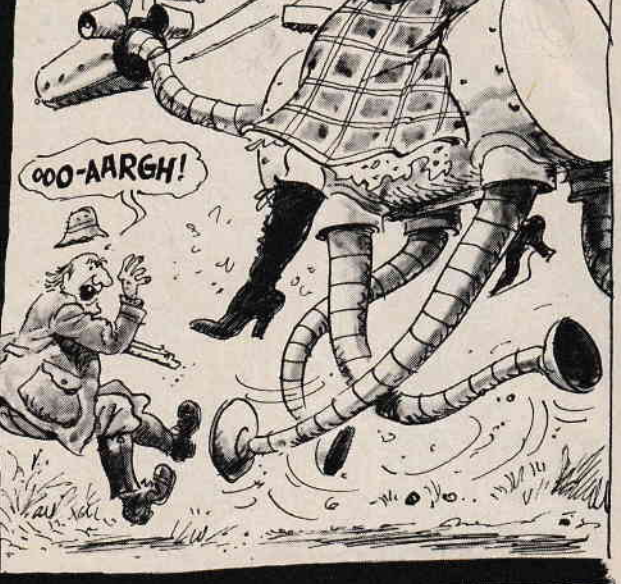

"The response we get means a lot to us," George explains. "It makes everything worthwhile." Even so, that doesn't mean he's prepared to reveal any secrets about the new series.

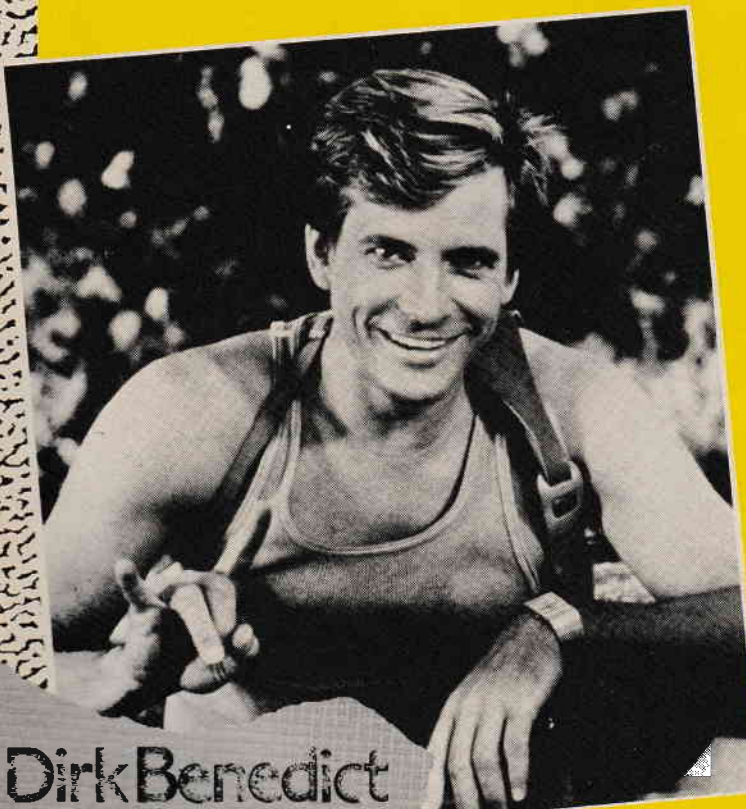
"What will it be like?" he says. "Well now, hang on a minute! You'll just have to wait and see! Let's just say that there could be a few surprises in store."

You can't say fairer than that, so while you're preparing for this weekend's action, here's an update on each of the team . . .

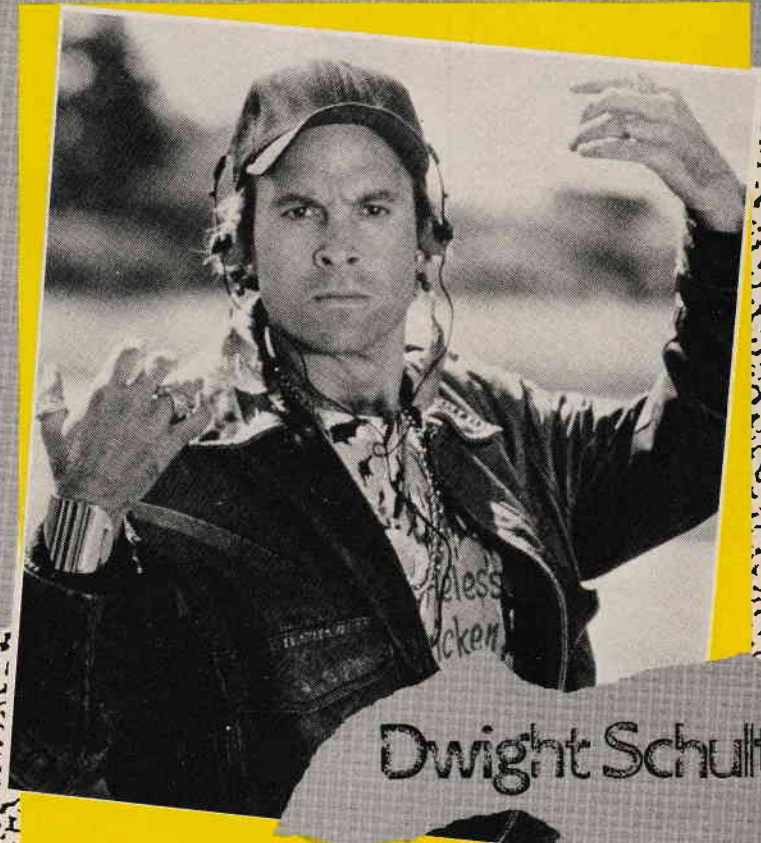

Midway through the US Open tennis championships at Flushing Meadow, New York, we turn our attention to a young man who caused a sensation when he snatched the Men's Singles title at this year's Wimbledon Championships.

■ Seven has got to be Boris Becker's lucky number. He won Wimbledon when he was 17 years, seven months and seven days old, and the finals took place on the seventh day of the seventh month!

When unseeded Boris beat South African born Kevin Curran in the final it looked as though he'd broken all the records. The previous youngest winner was Wilfred Baddeley who became title holder way back in 1891, aged 19. However, this was the first German-born player to win. That honour, believe it or not, belongs to John McEnroe, who was born in Wiesbaden.

Boris was born and brought up in the town of Leimen, near

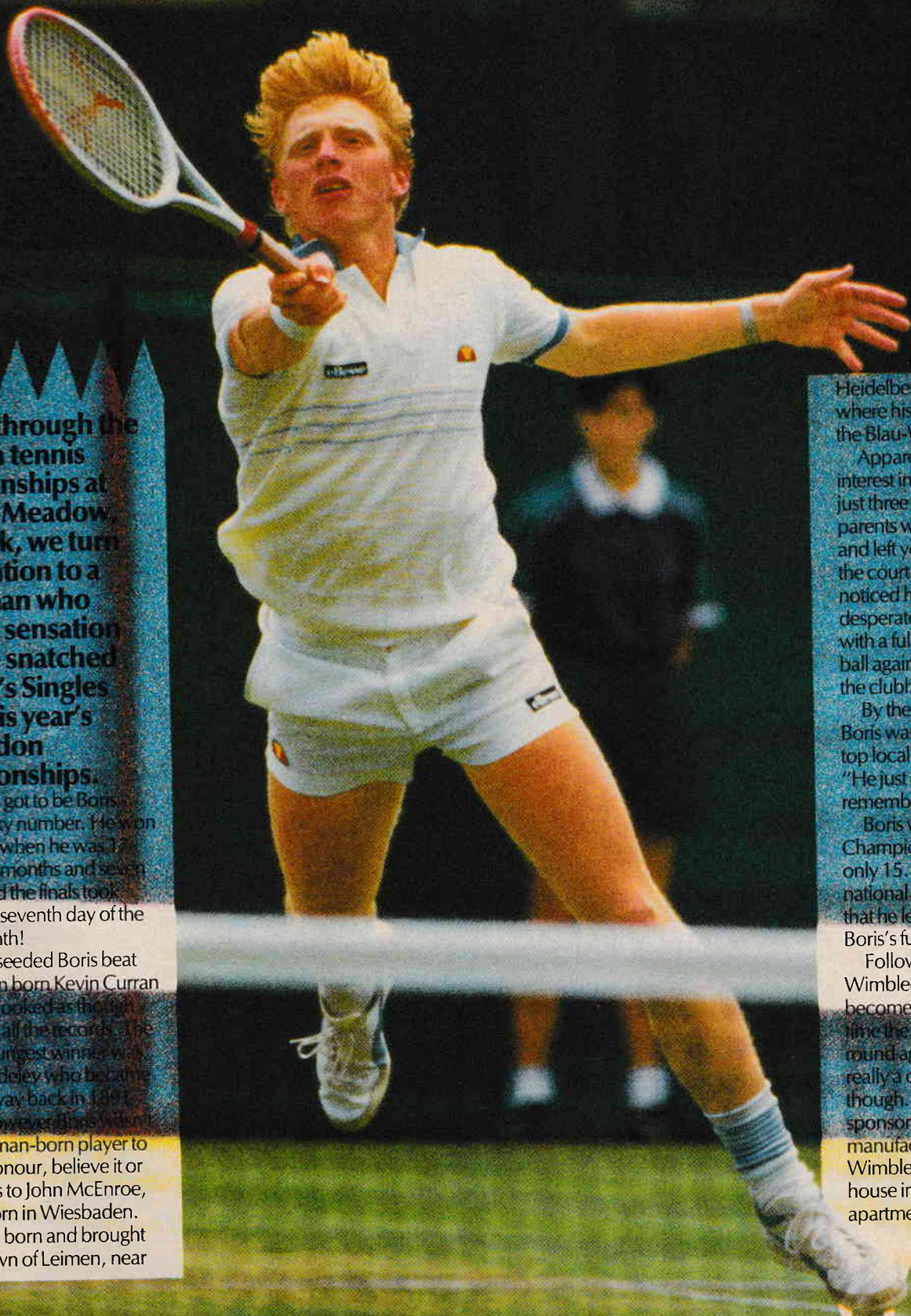
Heidelberg in West Germany, where his parents belonged to the Blau-Weiss tennis club.

Apparently Boris showed an interest in tennis when he was just three years old. One day his parents were playing a game and left young Boris at the side of the court. A few games later they noticed he'd gone but after a desperate search they found him with a full-sized racket hitting a ball against a wall at the back of the clubhouse.

By the time he was seven, Boris was being coached by a top local coach, Boris Breskva. "He just couldn't bear to lose," remembers his coach.

Boris won the West German Championship when he was only 15. He so impressed the national coach, Gunther Bosch that he left his job to become Boris's full time trainer.

Following his triumph at Wimbledon, Boris is all set to become a millionaire by the time the Championships come round again next year. It's not really a case of sudden riches though. He gets all sorts of sponsorships from sports goods manufacturers. Even before Wimbledon Boris owned a house in Monte Carlo and an apartment in New York.

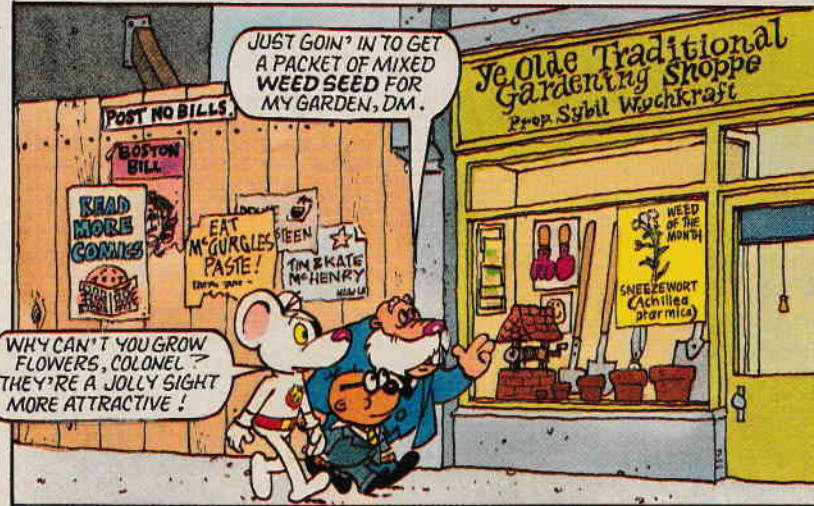

'Lots of times?'

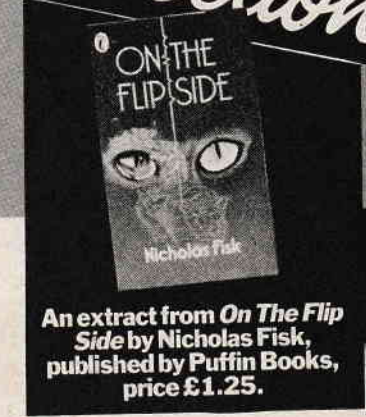

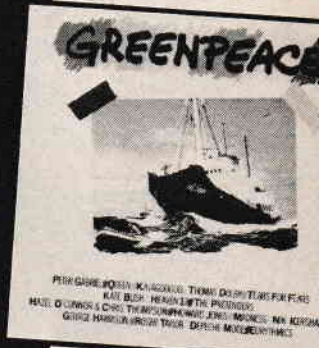

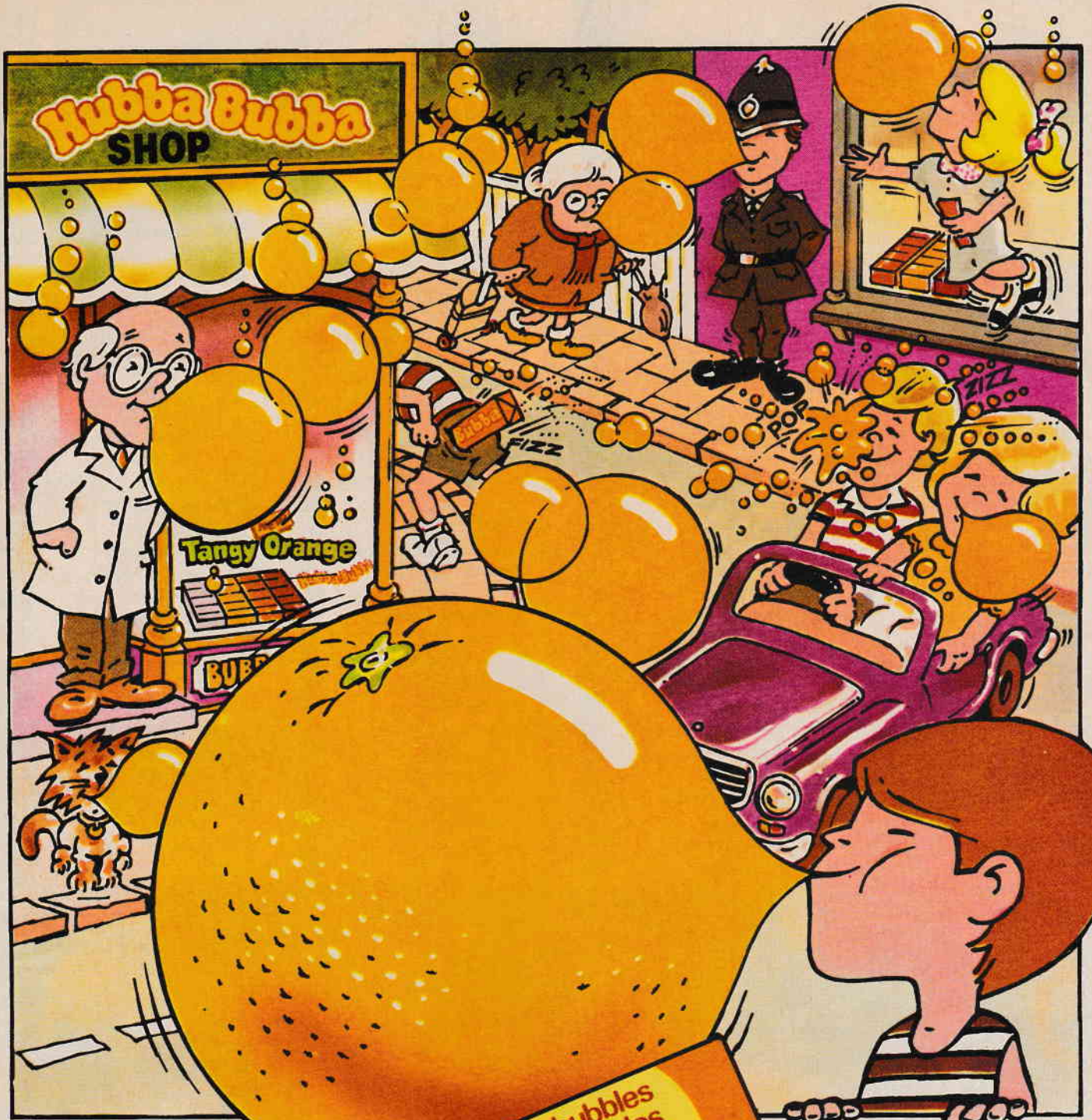
